PE and Sport Premium 2017-18 Plan

We will use the additional funding provided through the PE and Sports premium to meet the Department of Education's stated expectation that we will make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport that we offer. We will ensure that we continue our outstanding provision of PE and sport and further build upon our extremely strong infrastructure and provision to ensure that the children receive a wealth of sporting opportunities and a high quality Physical Education.

The impacts we are aiming for this academic year are:

- To ensure that lunchtimes are an active experience for children.
- To maintain high levels of participation in extra-curricular activities.
- To provide increased opportunities for participation in intra school sport through the School Games.

Our plan for the use of the 2017-18 PE and Sport Premium Budget is shown below.

During the 2017 - 2018 academic year the school will receive additional funding of £18,710 for PE and School sport (£16,000 plus £10/child). The school will receive 7/12 in October and 5/12 in April.
